Get ready to evacuate when the time comes; it could save your life.

Even under the COVID-19 circumstances:

In the event of a disaster, evacuate from hazardous places immediately

5 points you should know

- "Evacuate" means to escape from danger. If you are in a safe place, you do not need to go to an evacuation shelter.
- Evacuation shelters are not limited to elementary/junior high schools or community centers, consider staying with your relatives or friends if they live in a safe place.
- Because of a shortage of PPE(personal protective equipment) such as masks, disinfectant and thermometers, bring your own when possible.
- The evacuation shelters currently designated by your local government may have been relocated or new ones added. Make sure to get the latest official information.
- Going outside during torrential rain is dangerous, even by car. If you have no choice but to spend the night in your car, pay great attention to your surroundings, be especially careful of floods.
